Task 1: Character Profiles

Try to separate your information into paragraphs.

Challenge:

Can you use any words from the story to help you describe them and put them in quotation marks?

e.g. The other children thought Mildred was "clumsy" as she was always falling off her broom.

Task 2: Instructions
