

How to Pack a Shoebox

Shoebox Appeal

1. First get an empty shoebox.
2. Then, wrap the lid and box **separately**.
3. Stick on a 'girl' or 'boy' **label** to show who your box is for.
4. Tick the correct age.
5. Next, put a big **exciting** present in the box. For **example**, a doll, a teddy bear or a small football.
6. After, put in a **variety** of small toys and items they may need, such as soap and a flannel.
7. Then **donate** £3 for the **delivery** of your box.
8. Put the £3 in an envelope inside the shoebox.
9. Finally take your shoebox to a drop off **location**.
